### Annual Phi Beta Kappa Lecture Scheduled for April 15, 1998

Dr. James Przybylski, Professor of Political Science, Truman State University, will be the featured speaker for this years' Phi Beta Kappa Lecture. Please join us in the Spanish Room on the campus of Truman State University, on April 15, 1998, at 12:30 p.m.

The lecture is co-sponsored by the Phi Beta Kappa Association of Northeast Missouri and the Office of Faculty Development at Truman State University.

Dr. Przybylski's topic is "Political Change?" He will discuss how the changes in the American political system over the past thirty years have, ironically, often had the effect of making policy change more difficult. He will discuss how these changes have strengthened the hand of the already powerful elements of our society.
