Abstract: The University of Missouri-Rolla offers Masters and PhD degrees in Applied Mathematics, including a degree with concentration in Statistics. Dr. Drain will describe the program and give details on the classes and activities of our graduate students. He will describe the research going on here in statistics and other fields of mathematics, and in particular will give details on some work in supersaturated design by a UMR graduate student. Dr. Drain will also describe life after graduation: the kinds of jobs statisticians do, and the environments in which they work. There will be ample time for questions.

David Drain is an industrial statistician with 23 years of experience in manufacturing, consulting and software development. He received the master of science degree in applied statistics from Bowling Green State University in 1980, and the doctor of philosophy degree in industrial engineering from Arizona State University in 2003. Dr. Drain began his academic career in 2003 as an Assistant Professor in the Mathematics and Statistics Department at the University of Missouri, Rolla.
